1. Why are we having the CIT 2008 Picnic at Lake Needwood?

Lake Needwood is a beautiful 75 acre park that offers many amenities such as boating, shelters, hiking, playgrounds, a volley ball pit, accessible restrooms, and ample - free- parking. 4. What will I get for lunch?

7. Why is transportation not provided this year?

There is ample free parking at Lake Needwood, and people will have the flexibility to come and go as needed.

We have rented four spacious covered shelters, which are in a shaded area.
